EDUCATION THROUGH THE SNAP-Ed PROGRAM

What is SNAP-Ed? The **Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program – Education (SNAP-Ed)** is a federally funded grant program that supports free evidence-based nutrition education and obesity prevention interventions and projects for persons eligible for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) through complimentary direct education.

Where are the programs conducted? Education is available at community settings serving these individuals (which include children and families). Schools are eligible for free nutrition education from a community educator if over 50% of their students qualify for free and reduced price lunches.
