

Tips to Implement Integrated Weed Management on Crop Land in Delaware



Integrated Weed Management (IWM) is an approach to managing weeds using multiple control tactics. The purpose of IWM is to include many methods in a growing season to allow producers the best chance to control troublesome weeds. Here are some tips for implementing IWM in farm crops.

- O Use a combination of preventive, cultural, mechanical and chemical practices.
- o Incorporate different methods of weed management into a combined effort to control weeds.
- O Use non-herbicide approaches in combination with multiple, effective sites of action for long-term success.
- Some options that are easier to implement include: equipment cleaning, timely scouting, altering herbicide tank mixes; while more extensive options include: changing crop rotation, cover cropping, changing tillage practices, and harvest time weed seed control.
